A Message from Rev. Dr. Roger Paavola, President

ow do we view the call of Christ to bring the message of life and salvation with outreach to a dark and decaying world? We have heard the adage, "The best defense is a good offense." It's been applied to games and military combat. The idea is that a strong offense instead of a passive attitude will preoccupy the opposition and ultimately hinder its ability to mount a counterattack. One style of Kung Fu uses the maxim: "The hand which strikes also blocks."

In World War I, Germany attacked France quickly to knock it out of the war. Its numerical superiority freed up numbers of German troops to head east and defeat Russia. In chess, one's ability to prevent enemy attacks often depends on maintaining a series of threats on

the opponent. An offense used in conjunction with this adage upsets an opponent's plan. The best way to stop an opponent is to attack the opponent's king and queen.

In football the adage is an effective offense that keeps the ball on the other team's side of the field, thus not only creating scoring opportunities but preventing the opposing team from scoring. In courts of Law, the adage is applied when the defense counsel attacks and breaks the prosecutor's case.

The topic gained increased prominence as a military strategy during the Cold War with regard to the use of nuclear weapons. It related to the concept of mutual destruction where a full-scale nuclear attack would devastate both parties. Shock and Awe tactics were used in the Gulf War as a military strategy using overwhelming power and spectacular displays of force to paralyze the enemy.

Military War strategists have identified four vital characteristics of Shock and Awe:

- 1. Near total knowledge and understanding of one's self, the adversary, and the battlefield environment;
- 2. Act with Rapidity and a timely application;
- 3. Maintain Operational brilliance: and
- 4. Equip for total control and management signature of the entire operational environment.

In two weeks we're entering the season of Lent. For over 30 years of Christ's earthly life, Satan showed his evil shock and awe – his vulgar offense. But none of it compared to the preemptive assault on Jesus during the week of Christ's passion. If it was a chess game, observers would have seen an entire nation turn madly against the Man they welcomed days earlier as their king. Leaders of the church worked every strategy to trap Jesus into treason against Rome and blasphemy against God.

His closest friends abandoned him, leaving Christ vulnerable to open attacks. Scribes and Pharisees used Judas in a gambit to capture Jesus. A Roman Governor faded in recognizing Jesus' innocence. And Roman soldiers took great pleasure in scourging Him and nailing Christ onto the cruelest instrument of execution ever known.

By Good Friday afternoon, it appeared that Satan's Shock and Awe attack on the Savior of the world was checkmate. Around 3PM, Jesus died in the wrath of God against the sins of the world that weighed down the precious life of Christ. But... Satan's gambit hadn't calculated what the death of the very Son of God really meant for you and me and all people.

God's plan for our salvation for us included Christ's suffering. It included His friends abandoning Him. It

included the weight of the sins of all the world to be laid on the sacred head of Jesus. But the greatest Shock and Awe in God's plan of salvation was the glorious, victorious, celebratory resurrection of Christ Jesus in flesh to prove God's satisfaction of Christ's sacrifice for our sins, and our justification by God's grace and mercy on to our eternal salvation.

His resurrection was so powerful, even on that day that the earth shook, many of the faithful also rose to foreshow the final resurrection of all on the Lord's day. It was no game. This is war! But it is ours... carrying the very message Christ has given to us, His Church... to become warriors in the army of Christ to go on offense, knowing that not even the gates of Hell can prevail over the Gospel message of forgiveness, life, and peace with God... now and forever. Amen.


