A swe prepare for our Lenten journey, we will attend Ash Wednesday services and hear the words pronounced to each of us, "Dust you are, and to dust you will return." It's a sobering moment. We wonder, isn't there something more?" In the 15th century, Queen Isabella's Spanish fleet at first carried a flag that said, *Non Plus Ultra* It meant, "Nothing More Beyond." But when Christopher Columbus sailed to North America she changed her flag to say, "Plus Ultra." – there is more beyond.

It's been twenty-one years this month when our eyes looked toward the heavens to see if we could find answers to yet another tragedy. We scanned the newspapers and glued our eyes to the TV to find out what happened to the space shuttle Columbia. There is *Plus Ultra* - something more

beyond. Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die."

Recently, a dear friend asked me if it was OK to pray to God that he might be taken to heaven. I read the words from St. Paul writes, *"I* am pulled in two directions. I want very much to leave this life and be with the Lord, which is a far better thing, but for your sake, it is much more important that I remain alive... to add to your progress and joy in faith."

We recall the inspiration given to the Apostles - where the great cloud of witnesses, the patriarchs, the prophets, the Apostles and elders - generation after generation of family and friends who truly rest from their labors. But Scripture says we don't mourn like those who have no hope. These saints are in the New Jerusalem where God wipes away every tear. There is no more death, no more sorrow or pain.

That's why St Paul says he's torn. Separation from this life into the company of the sainted only means standing in a different place with the people who professed their faith in God's promise in Christ. We're in the same mystical body of Christ with them. This includes all the saints we can see and all the saints who have gone to be in glory.

When we gather around the communion rail, we gather in a semicircle to symbolize that same mystical union around the same living Christ. When we chant "Hosanna," we sing together with the whole company of the saints gathered around the throne of God. We're bound together with them in one great exalted hymn to praise our God. The circle is completed by Christ who serves us and joins us together with Him as the triumphant Lamb of God.

With Paul we prepare for the glorious place. Our eyes are fixed toward the heavens. We're reminded by the order of God's creation that we live in His grace. Not only that, but in our worship and devotions, we're brought into the fellowship of saints of all ages. Our hope of eternal life with Him is secure. Our faith reminds us that His Son died a most horrible and innocent death to secure our eternal life - beyond the tragedies and pains of this life.

That's what Paul points out since he knew his days were numbered. But he was prepared, because his trust was in the grace of God through Jesus Christ. Dr. Donald Deffner wrote in his book, *Bound to be Free*, about his final wishes. He asked his family to put a special epitaph on his tombstone that reads "I know whom I have believed." In the same way, we're to watch and pray - to be ready and prepare at all times.

The first century Christians lived in an expectation that Jesus would return in their lifetime. And so should we. He's 2024 years closer to His great and awesome day than He was back then. In the Revelation to St. John, he writes, *"He who testifies to these things says, 'Yes I am coming soon.' Amen. It is so. Come Lord Jesus, Come."* Therefore, as saints by the power of God, we live each day, knowing that each earthly day is a gift from God that will never come again.

Dr. Deffner tells of a bedside visit with an old pastor on his deathbed. After many hours, Dr. Deffner asked the old pastor, "What do you think about your own death?" The old pastor looked carefully at the ceiling of his hospital room and began to slowly answer, "I do not fear death, because I trust in the Lord." Then a smile came across his face and he added, "But, I wouldn't court death, either."



I once worked with a man who was dying of an incurable disease. He told me, "Each night I thank God for another day and ask that I may remain in His will. In the morning I thank God that He has kept me safe through another night and allows me to remain in His will throughout the day." Christians faced with reality of life's progress. We face it with zeal and vitality because we know the promises of God. "He is able to guard what I have entrusted to Him for that day," Paul wrote to his young friend, Timothy.

You have heard about the Iditarod dog sled race. It's a 1000 miles of wilderness is covered for the sake of bragging rights of who is the best musher in the world. In 1987 and in 1988, a woman won the competition. She pressed through blizzards, dark nights, bitter 50 and 60 below zero temperatures to win over her competitors. She had prepared for the bitter race conditions, making booties for each of her dogs. Instead of having the snow act like sandpaper to the dog's feet, her dogs feet were strong and in condition to pull, bark, and press forward to the goal of the Iditarod.

This isn't a moralistic poke in the belly to say, "You can do it, you just have to try harder." Rather, it's an illustration to look at the saints who have gone before us to glory. They didn't rely on their own strength, but, rather, as Paul says, "Our strength comes from God."

We may at times to think that God realize what happens to us. We pray, "Lord You know we have problems in this country. You know we have problems with our health. You know there's troubles in the world... etcetera." What's the matter? Don't we remember that all things are known by God?! Silence from God doesn't mean He isn't watching. His Word remains active. In His sacraments He visits us and sustains us. "I will never leave you nor forsake you," Jesus reminds all His followers. Those who knew His promise by faith and trusted His guidance on the shuttle Columbia were never shaken from that truth. We are comforted to know they now rest in that ever-growing circle of the saints around His throne in glory.

As we begin our Lenten journey beneath the cross of Christ, we'll be reminded that, "Dustyou are; and to dust you will return. May we, like all the saints around the throne of the Lamb, be always faithful, knowing that the Lord is at our side. May our lives carry the flag of that marks the fleet of the Christian army, *"Plus Ultimata,"* There is more much more - beyond.
