## Mary's Song

Mary's song, the Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55) is magnificent! It is a divinely revealed expression of a deep and highly developed faith. That Mary could sing this canticle of praise to God in the face of the external absurdity of the situation she finds herself in is truly a miracle: "A virgin maiden is pregnant!" Yet the whole of our Christian faith partakes of such impossibilities! How likely is it that a virgin conceives and bears a child? How likely is it that God takes on human flesh? How likely is it that the Child worshiped by the Magi is very God of very God? How likely is it that this one Man's death pays for the sin of the world? How likely is that the Crucified One also rose from the dead? How likely is it that Christ Jesus, in human flesh, is seated at the right hand of God? How likely is it that He will come to judge the living and the dead? How likely is it that the bread of the Supper is His body and the wine His blood? How likely is it that baptism gives life eternal? How likely is it that mere speech can deliver perfect forgiveness to us?

Once you start sorting through the teachings of the Bible to pick those you like or that you think might be likely or even remotely possible, everything that makes Christianity Christianity will be put in jeopardy. The teachings of the Bible will either hang together or they will hang separately, disintegrated into nothingness. Either God can do what He says, or He is not God.

Mary's Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55) announces the salvation that belongs to us all. "And Mary said, 'My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for God has looked with favor on the *lowliness of the Almighty's servant.* Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is God's name. God's mercy is for those who fear God from generation to generation. God has shown strength with God's arm; God has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. God has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; God has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. God has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of God's mercy, according to the promise God made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever."

The Magnificat is revolutionary song – a song of salvation whose political, economic, and social dimensions can never be diminished. People in need in every society, from every generation, and from every language need to hear the blessings in this canticle. The battered woman and children, the single parent without resources, the homeless thousands, those without food on their table, the young abandoned to their own devices, the old who are discarded – all of us are embraced in God's grace in the hope of Mary's proclamation.

The words of Mary's Magnificat were banned - sung or read – in India under British rule. In the 1980's, it was banned in Guatemala. In the Mother's of the Plaza de Mayo in Argentina, the words of the Magnificat were placed on the capital plaza in commemoration of the thousands of children who all disappeared during the Dirty War between 1976 and 1983. However, the Magnificat's words on posters in the capital plaza were removed by the military junta of Argentina. Anyone caught with a poster with the words were imprisoned because the junta outlawed any public display of Mary's song.

What is so powerful in these words that anti-Christian factions would outlaw these words from

Holy Scripture? It speaks of faith faith that is the God-given means by which we embrace the hope of God's promise of life and salvation in His Son, Jesus Christ. We want the faith of this little girl, Mary, who when confronted by the angel of the Lord, trusts what God promised to her, "You will bear God's Son and He will save the people from their sins." She shows deep faith responding to this impossible promise, "May it be to me even as You have said." This is the only possible attitude of the Christian believer to the speech of God. She does not quiz God about how He might carry out this virginal conception. She is, of course, aware of how humans normally bear children, but the promise of the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit is sufficient for her because it is God's own explanation of her virgin conception.


Martin Luther wrote, "Isaiah announced: 'There shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse. and a flower shall rise up out of his root, and the Holy Spirit shall rest upon Him' (Isaiah 11:1-2). The stem and root is the generation of Jesse or David, in particular the Virgin Mary; the rod and flower is Christ. Now, as unlikely, indeed as incredible, a thing it is that a fair branch and flower should spring from a dry and withered stem and root, just so unlikely was it that Mary the Virgin should become the mother of such a child. For I take it that she is called a stem and root not only because she

became a mother in a miraculous manner without violation of her virginity—just as it is miraculous to make a branch grow out of a dead tree stump."

The church sings the Magnificat with her. In that faithful singing the whole Church throughout history partakes of its promises. When we sing it, we share in its faith. Like Mary, the Church wears the virgin's gown of holiness from God. The Church too confesses that what God makes possible, comes to be, even if it seems impossible to us. The Magnificat highlights God's willingness to make foolish man's wisdom in the lowly conception and birth of His Son. Only as we look down in wonderment can we find God's gaze fixed upon His Son. Over and over again we must go to the Word of God to know what God accomplished hidden under the conception and birth of this little Child of the humble peasant mother. This is God's Son born for YOU! Have a blessed Advent and Christmas as we all celebrate the precious gift of God's enduring grace, mercy, and peace through Jesus Christ - the Christ Child born for us all.

# **2021 Mid-South District Convention Proceedings**







### **Lutheran World Relief CARE-VAN Drive 2022**

At this year's Lutheran World Relief CARE-VAN ingathering the Mid-South District once again had seven drop sites where we collected handmade quilts, school kits, personal care kits, baby care kits, and fabric kits. Our drop sites included Grace, Knoxville, TN.; Cross of Christ, Chattanooga, TN.; Our Savior, Nashville, TN.; Immanuel, Memphis, TN.; First, Fort Smith, AR.; Zion of Avilla, Alexander, AR.; and Salem, Springdale, AR.

At the time of this report (11/11/2022), the top three quilt-producing congregations that dropped off their work at an LWR CARE-VAN ingathering site were Cross of Christ Lutheran Church, Chattanooga, TN (114 quilts), First Lutheran Church, Cleveland, TN (96 quilts) and First Lutheran Church, Fort Smith, AR (80 quilts). At this time, a total of 631 quilts have been donated.

To date we had 22 congregations participate (3 ELCA), collecting over \$2,196 for shipping costs. We also collected 754 personal care kits (one congregation donated 350 personal care kits!), 119 fabric kits, 567 school kits, 81 baby care kits, and 50 face masks were also donated. The CARE-VAN trailers were loaded up with 302 boxes (weighing approximately 5,542 pounds!) of offerings from District congregations for Lutheran World Relief. Way to go Mid-South District!

We were blessed to have representatives from Lutheran World Relief, Vicki and Ed Whetstone, join us at two of the drop off locations!

Here is a snippet from one of the circuit coordinators at the Memphis drop off location, Diane Reimold who has been the CARE-Van Coordinator for the Memphis Circuit for 4 years:

"2022 was one of the best years for donations. COVID certainly was the reason for the lack of donations the past 2 years. Once 2022 got here, we were ready to be together again!! Most of the CARE-Van donations are organized by LWML groups and in 2022, 7 congregations participated and one individual. The total donations amounted to 59 boxes weighing 1222 lbs. and included 69 quilts, 121 personal care kits, 200 school kits, 46 baby care kits, and \$362.88 to help Lutheran World Relief with shipping costs. This was way over the 14 boxes weighing 271 lbs. that were donated in 2021! We had a lady who donated 3 quilts who is not currently affiliated with a Lutheran Church. She located us on the LWR website and read about the gatherings across the country. She worked through Julie Tyler at the district office to get more information and set up a time to deliver her donation at the drop off site. She hopes to make more quilts for next year's event. Knowing there are random people looking for ways to help others is so heart-warming. Thank you to all the congregations in our district who contributed to CARE-Van this year. Our donations WILL make a difference in people's lives."

Many of the congregations' efforts are coordinated by LWML groups and longstanding quilting groups in the congregations. They participate in this effort to share the love of Christ in a personal way. The tireless efforts of those who share their talents and the generous contributions of many make this a successful ingathering.

Thank you to all who participated in this year's annual LWR CARE-VAN drive! You touched someone in need!


