Church and State Today: Political Changes and Confessional Challenges

*The 2023 convention asked the CTCR to update its guidance on church, state, and the Christian love of neighbor, “especially in light of an increasing hostility toward the Christian faith.” Since the CTCR’s original report on church and state, 1995’s *Render unto Caesar*, American culture and the American church have both undergone significant changes that have raised questions about the church’s ability to remain faithful to its confession while also making a difference in civic life. How can we avoid the Scylla and Charybdis of “activism” and “quietism”? How can we respect governing authorities, as Paul and Peter urge us, when those governing authorities oppose or prohibit our confession of the faith? Is there really a single definitive “Lutheran” perspective on church and state, and, if so, what is it? How should we interact with recent Christian political trends such as Roman Catholic Integralism or Neo-Reformed Christian Nationalism? We will use the recent CTCR report to discuss the contemporary political changes and challenges to the relationship of church and state in this country, the Lutheran theological framework of the two kingdoms, the Lutheran teaching on the three estates, and specific practical guidelines for maintaining our moral authority without simply becoming political partisans.*
