Delegation Selects Mission & Ministry Directives for Synod

In addition to numerous elections and consideration of about twenty resolutions, delegates of the 22nd Regular Convention of the Mid-South District chose three recommended areas of focus to present to Synod for the 2026-2029 triennium. On Saturday morning, following voting on all Floor Committee resolutions, delegates were given seven mission and ministry initiatives, put forth by the Circuit and Advisory Forums. The following three initiatives received the most votes and will therefore be advanced for consideration at the next Synodical Convention in 2026:

FOCUS #1—

To encourage young families and encourage the health of marriage and the vitality of the devotional life in the home.

FOCUS #2 —

Work to resolve human trafficking and raise awareness to address the challenges of a world that does not respect the value God has given to male and female.

FOCUS #3 —

Formation and spiritual strengthening of Elders and Lay Leaders in the congregation.

Over 160 voting delegates were in attendance at the 22nd Regular Convention, representing 88 congregations of the Mid-South District. Over the course of their short time together, these delegates reviewed and carefully considered just over twenty resolutions, covering an array of issues that are important to the ministries of this District, and their many members. By the close of the convention on Saturday morning, delegates had voted to adopt the following resolutions:

- Resolution 01-01-25: To Reaffirm Church Planting
- Resolution 01-02-25: To Continue a Relationship with the Southeast of Lake Victoria Diocese (SELVD) of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania
- Resolution 01-03-25: To Continue a Relationship with the Confessional Malagasy Lutheran Church in Madagascar
- Omnibus Resolution 01-04-25: To Commend Trinity Hope
- Resolution 02-01-25: To Maintain Accountability and Transparency for Financial Gifts from God's Stewards
- Resolution 02-02-25: To Encourage Financial Support for Professional Church Workers
- Resolution 02-03-25: To Propose LCMS Men's Ministry
- Resolution 02-04-25: To Establish Locum Tenens Ministry for the Mid-South District
- Omnibus Resolution 02-06A-25: Ten Commandments
- Resolution 03-01-25: To Shape the Faith Formation Paradigm from Generation to Generation Ministry
- Resolution 03-02-25: *To Encourage Generational Ministry*
- Resolution 03-03-25: To Evaluate, Study, and Use Biblically-based Stewardship Resources
- Resolution 03-04-25: To Encourage Personal Evangelism
- Resolution 04-01-25: To Encourage Further Consideration of Successful Completion of SMP Coursework Before Ordination and Placement on Ordained Roster
- Resolution 04-02-25: Regularizing Specific Ministry Pastoral Classification

- Resolution 04-07A-25: To Direct The Office of the National and International Mission to Decline Applications for Recognized Service Organization Status from Organizations Currently Supporting, Advocating, or Otherwise Promoting the LGBTQIA+ Agenda and Lifestyle and to direct The Office of National Missions and The Office of International Mission to Revoke RSO Status of the Same
- Resolution 04-08-25: Participating in Building a Culture of Church Work Formation and Recruitment
